Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) – 13th June 2021 1st Reading – Ezekiel 17:22-24 Psalm – It is good to give you thanks, O Lord. 2nd Reading – 2 Corinthians 5:6-10

Gospel – Mark 4:26-34

This Sunday, our Archbishop Bernard is setting before us an invitation to renewal. For the Archdiocese to be renewed means for all of us to be renewed. That journey is both a personal one and that of the whole community. We know that the lifting of restrictions may be delayed due to the latest variant of the virus, but we can use this moment to reflect on the experience of the pandemic and what we have learned from it in order to look ahead with greater hope. I encourage you to read the Archbishop's letter that will be available on our website, to look at the Archdiocese's website too with the relevant information as it appears there in the coming weeks concerning our intention to be renewed in our life of faith. In the mean-time the Archbishop is encouraging us to reflect on the following aspects of the diocesan mission:

Speaking of diocesan renewal, we as Capuchins are also in the process of undergoing more changes. On Saturday 19th June we will have an on-line ceremony during which the current British Province will become a Delegation of the Irish Province. It is a historic moment as the English Province came into being on the 1st August 1873. It is a sign of our diminishing numbers in the UK, and our ever-greater reliance on friars from other countries to support our continued presence and ministry in the UK. Apart from that historic occasion we will also have some changes in our fraternity here in Oxford. Br. Martin Sanderson, our newly ordained priest will be joining us here by the 12th July and will become the guardian of our fraternity. Near the end of July Br. Lucjan will be taking his well-deserved sabbatical until Easter 2022. Brs. Antonio, Antony, Pradeep live in hope of visiting their families this summer in Italy and India and please God will be able to travel by the end of this month. We ask your prayers for their safety and blessings during their time away. We as friars are extremely grateful for your support, generosity, and kindness.

Happy Feast Day! – This Sunday is the 13th June which means only one thing – it is the feast of St. Anthony of Padua. Our Lord is more important and therefore we are not celebrating St. Anthony this year at Mass. However, we are celebrating the feast day of Br. Antony and Br. Antonio. Pray for them today, the more the better! May the Lord continue to bless them and guide them in the Capuchin way of life.

Readers – I would like to invite all those who read the Word of God during our Masses for a couple of hours of prayer / reflection on Saturday 26th June at 4pm in the church. It will be a great time to meet all of you, and hopefully a good opportunity to remind ourselves of the important ministry that you do for the community. I look forward to meeting all of you, as well as anyone who may be interested in reading during Mass. If you cannot attend, please let me know.

Day for Life – Next weekend we will be celebrating a Day for Life. We will have a second collection to fund the work of organizations that support the dignity of human life and the Church's teaching. Your prayers and your generosity will help the Church's campaign to oppose the Bill on assisted suicide.

Franciscan Spirituality Sessions – Our next session will be on Friday 18th June at 7.30pm. Important information for EU Citizens

30th June: There's a Very Important Deadline Looming!

Please spread the word. There are just over three weeks to go. Eu 26 citizens who do not register an application for Settled Status before 30th June may find their freedom to live and work in the UK is jeopardised. It applies regardless of how long you have been resident in the UK; it **also applies to children born here of EU citizens, and non-EU family members of EU citizens.** You can read more on this Government website

You can ask for help with your application at Europa Welcome, a branch of Asylum Welcome, based in East Oxford. They can help with language problems and have information on their website in Romanian, Portuguese, Spanish, Italian, and **Tetum**, the language of East Timor, many of whose citizens hold Portuguese passports.
