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## 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) – 14<sup>th</sup> February 2021

1<sup>st</sup> Reading – Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46
Psalm – You are my refuge, O Lord; you fill me with the joy of salvation.

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading – 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1

Gospel – Mark 1:4-45

The leper is declared unclean and must live outside the camp. A life of forced seclusion, deprived of the normal status afforded to everyone else in society. A leper does not belong. Jesus encountering the leper in today's Gospel not only restores the leper's physical health, but alongside it he restores the person's dignity and a place within society, where the cured man no longer needs to stay outside the camp but can belong once again. Jesus gives to the man much more than just physical well-being.


The remarkable thing is the exchange that takes place between the leper and the Lord. Instead of the leper having to stay outside the camp, it is now Jesus who 'could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived' as the Gospel puts it. One could say that Jesus is the one who now does not belong, and yet the crowds still come to him.

As we enter into the holy season of Lent this Wednesday, this swapping of places between Jesus and the leper takes on real significance for us. The Lord is taking on our sicknesses, our sins on His shoulders, and He is willingly beginning to pay the price of our salvation. Through His wounds we are healed, and the rejection of Jesus will culminate on the Cross, when He is taken outside the city to be crucified for our sins. Jesus chose to go through all this to reveal the extent of His love and power and the question for us this Lent is what will we choose to go through for His sake. He suffered the consequences of bringing new life to the leper, are we ready to suffer for the same cause? What will be the price demanded of us if we wish to be as life giving as Jesus was in today's Gospel? Whatever the answer may be, let us pray together with the psalmist today: 'You are my refuge, O Lord; you fill me with the joy of salvation'. Let us remember this season of grace, this time of penance is a time of joy, given to us to renew ourselves and have our dignity and health restored. We continue to pray for one another that we'll make the most of the opportunities this time brings.
