Twenty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) - 5th September 2021

1st Reading – Isaiah 35:4-7
Psalm – My soul, give praise to the Lord.

2nd Reading – James 2:1-5
Gospel – Mark 7:31-37

For those of you who managed to take some time away for a holiday, welcome back. The words of the Lord remind us not to be afraid, but to face life with courage, for the Lord is coming to save us. The Good News is that He has indeed come to save us, and that God continues to come to us. The Lord continues to teach us, to open our ears and restore our sight. The gentle way in which all this takes place often means we fail to notice it happening at all. That is why we keep praying, that is why we return to Him day after day so as not to miss the times the Lord visits us throughout each day.

It may be worthwhile to reflect on how God comes to us. It is always easier to imagine that when all goes well then this means we are close to God and He listens to us. It is harder to be convinced of His presence when we receive suffering at the hands of others, misfortunes, humiliations, pain, when somebody tells us a few home truths we would rather not face, when no one seems to be listening. It is a real fight at times to hold on to His words over and above our experience or the words of others. Our longing will triumph and the Lord will change all our hardship into glory. Prophet Isaiah reminds us of this today. Our souls that feel crushed, that feel like deserts, wastelands, scorched earth, parched land – all will be transformed into places teeming with life full of water. For as long as we truly long for Him to save us, we often don't notice that we are filled with life already.

This Sunday, just like any other, we present our wounds to the Lord. We renew our trust in Him, that He can really heal us, that He only needs to say one word, and we will be healed. The saints teach us that true blindness is not seeing how really blind we are. Let us not be afraid to admit or see ourselves as the man in the Gospel today. We don't have to be brought along by others to meet the Lord, we can make that journey ourselves. We can all learn to pray for our spiritual senses to be restored in order to hear God speak to us and to see Him.

Sick friars – Thank you for all your prayers for our sick brothers in the friary, especially Br. Charles and Br. Ambrose. Br. Charles is being looked after at St. Luke's since beginning of August. Br. Ambrose has been admitted to hospital during the week and is will be staying there this weekend. Please continue to pray for both of them at this time.

Parish Renovations — Those of you who look around our parish church building and the parish hall might have noticed that they require a lot of work to maintain them and renovate them. The first thing we are addressing is the number of leaks that cause damage to both buildings. The work has begun this week and we hope it will proceed successfully so that we maintain the sacred space in good order and make a good start towards renovating our parish hall. To do this essential work of preventing further water damage to our buildings will cost us in the region of £10,000. I will update you with details as we go along. In the meantime, I would like to thank you for your generosity towards the upkeep of the parish, and invite your prayer that Our Lord would open the hearts of further benefactors to support us.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament – From Monday we will resume our regular times for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. That means we can spend some time in silent prayer with the Lord after morning Mass Mon-Fri until 8.30am, and on Saturday until 9.00am, as well as Saturday evening from 5.30pm till 6.15pm.

Parish Council – The Parish Council meets on a regular basis throughout the year to ensure we work together as a community of our Lord's disciples and address any aspects of our life together to support everyone in our life of faith. 1st Holy Communion / Confirmation 2022 – If you would like your child to receive the Sacraments of Holy Communion or Confirmation, please get in touch in order to sign your child for the relevant course. R.C.I.A. 2022 — If you are a Catholic who has never received the Sacrament of Confirmation, or you are interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church, then this course is for you. Please fill in the relevant form as soon as possible on our website or speak to one of the friars. Classes will commence in mid-October.
