3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (Sunday of the Word of God) – 24<sup>th</sup> January 2021

1<sup>st</sup> Reading – Jonah 3:1-5, 10 Psalm – Lord, make me know your ways. 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading – 1 Corinthians 7:29-31 Gospel – Mark 1:14-20

As we celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God, the readings portray the Word of God as powerful, effective, and desirable. The Word is addressed to us in order to bring us life, to instruct us, to teach us, to guide us, and eventually to bring us to the Father. It is the Father's Word that is proclaimed to us whenever we listen to the Scriptures, and His Word never comes back to Him empty. That Word is powerful, because through it everything was created, put in its rightful place, and kept in being. Through this powerful Word, our sins are forgiven, we are healed, cleansed, and brought back to life.

Our Father uses whatever means possible to get through to us and convince us of His great love and plan He has prepared for each of us. He always addresses us with love, and it is in that light that we need to see His corrections, rebukes, or chastisements. We all respond to different things better than others, we all need to hear certain truths at one time more than another, and the Lord achieves all that through His Word.

Notice that the Word of God never overpowers us, but simply calls and invites. We, just like the disciples in the Gospel and the people of Nineveh, have a choice. We need God to help us make the right choice that will lead us into true freedom. St. Bonaventure reminds us that what we need is a burning desire for God. Let us pray this week that our hearts will be re-awakened in their search for the Lord, that we will seek the Lord revealed to us in the Scriptures by reading them more often and praying with them.
