Twenty Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) – 3rd October 2021

1st Reading – Genesis 2:18-24
Psalm – May the Lord bless us all the days of our life.

2nd Reading – Hebrews 2:9-11
Gospel – Mark 10:2-16

On Sunday evening the whole Franciscan family will come together worldwide to recall the death of St. Francis of Assisi. Many years have passed since 1226, many men and women strived to follow his example and walked in the footsteps of our Lord as religious, and even greater numbers of men and women took St. Francis' spirituality as a model for their own lives in their family and places of work. That attraction still continues to this day, and his mission carries on by his followers.

As Franciscans, our first call is to support the Church, and Francis' answer to all that was going wrong with the Church at his time ought to be our answer too – learn to love. In order to repair and renew, Francis teaches us to love, to be obedient, and to be poor and humble. Living in this way will transform our vision of God and the world we live in, it will make us reach out and relate to all creation as a brother and sister. Our relationships will be healed and restored to their proper order. This is not just pious language but it has real implications for every day.

In order to love as a friar minor, a lesser brother as St. Francis called himself, he knew he had to embrace poverty and humility. This was his secret. He taught us to be content with little, not to be too attached to places, to live simply and at times lacking things — all that so we would keep our focus on the Lord and our final destination. His poverty put him at the centre of the mystery of the Cross, it helped him to long for union with God. We have a lot to learn from him, a lot we could imitate, a lot that we could aspire to and admire. More importantly, as St. Francis would say to us — I did what was mine to do, now it is your turn to work out with God's help what you have to do. Look ahead, go forward with confidence and do what the Lord is inspiring you to do.
