2nd Sunday of Lent (Year B) – 28th February 2021

1st Reading – Genesis 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18
Psalm – I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living

2nd Reading – Romans 8:31-34

Gospel – Mark 9:2-10

In a mysterious way, Abraham's willingness to sacrifice his own son, the promised one whom he awaited all his life, is just a glimpse of what God our Father has done in sending us His Son and allowing Him to be crucified. How can we imagine the extent of such great love, forgiveness, mercy, power? All for our sake so that we might live. Is it possible for us to remain indifferent in light of all that the Lord has done for us? As we continue our Lenten journey, it is worthwhile examining our life in relation to the gift of love. We can indeed sin against God's love in various ways by indifference, ingratitude, lukewarmness, acedia (spiritual sloth) to name a few (CCC – Catechism of the Catholic Church n. 2094).

To lead a penitential life, we first of all need to acknowledge our sin and to name it. Then we pray for the ability to do what we are invited to by the Father in the Gospel: 'Listen to Him. This my Son, the Beloved'. We would soon discover that the Lord is not as silent as we may often imagine. He left us His Word to speak to us — how often do we pick it up and read? He speaks through the teaching of the Church — when is the last time we looked something up in the Catechism or papal documents? He often uses other people to speak to us — do we really give enough attention to the other in our daily interactions? The Kingdom of God is within us — how well do I reflect on my inner life and deal with my thoughts, feelings, behaviour?

We are encouraged to find time for these things this Lent. The Lord wants us to be amazed at what He can reveal to us. He wishes us to experience what His Apostles went through on the mountain — pure wonder at what God is saying and doing, without fully understanding what is taking place in our lives. That transfiguration that they witnessed was just a glimpse of reality awaiting them and us. This time of mercy is our opportunity given to us by God to carry on this work of transfiguration. It is His work, but we are called to desire it and participate in this work with Him in so far as we are able. Let us continue to pray that our hearts, minds, ears be opened to His voice.



Important information for EU Citizens

If you are an EU passport holder and have not yet obtained Settled status please be aware that the deadline for this is the end of June this year. It applies regardless of how long you have been resident in the UK. Spread the word! You can ask for help with your application at **Europa Welcome**, based in East Oxford. They can help with language problems and have information on their website in **Tetum**, the language of East Timor, many of whose citizens hold Portuguese passports.
