Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) – 17th October 2021

1st Reading – Isaiah 53:10-11 Psalm – May your love be upon us, O Lord, as we place all our hope in you. 2nd Reading – Hebrews 4:14-16 Gospel – Mark 10:35-45

Suffering, temptation, service. This is the portrayal of the cost of true discipleship in today's readings. In other words, a reminder that we are all called to service, and in order to fulfil that mission well we need to prepare ourselves realistically to face suffering and temptation that will come our way. Is it possible for this message to become attractive? We cannot simply gloss over it and say to one another that it's just a small part to go through, and in the end, we need to focus on the Resurrection! If we wish jump over the mystery of the Cross too quickly, then as Jesus tells us, we have little to do with Him.

Prophet Isaiah tells us that it is precisely through the suffering of Jesus we have been justified, He took upon Himself our faults. He offered His very life for you and me, and left us an example to follow. Resurrection can only truly be experienced when our lives become selfless offerings after Our Lord's example, lives that are not so much focused on how do I get to heaven, but how can I facilitate that journey for my brothers and sisters. Many things will inevitably flow out of such reflection.

The Pastoral Letter from our Archbishop reminds us that the whole Church has begun a very special time dedicated to reflection on what the Holy Spirit is conveying to the Church at this time. As a parish community we also have a part to play in this whole process, and to use this time of grace to pray for the gift of greater openness to the Spirit of God and to one another. We always need to look forward with hope and trust that God is creating something new, essentially giving us a new heart. When the whole Church is seeking that newness, we may be sure that the Lord would never refuse us the gift of His Spirit. In the weeks to come we will respond more formally to the Church's call, but in the meantime let us continue to pray for the Spirit to be present and at work within us. **Br. Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers – Please inform the parish priest if you are an extraordinary eucharistic minister in the parish and would like to continue with this ministry. So far there has been no response since last week. This service is a vital support to our community in our celebrations of the Eucharist, as well as providing a visible link with our sick parishioners who can no longer join us for the celebration in church for whatever reason.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament – Just a note to remind all parishioners that our church opens from 5.30 p.m. on Saturday evenings for a time of silent adoration of the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. It is a perfect opportunity for some quiet prayer and reflection, which ends at 6.15 p.m. with benediction.

1st Holy Communion / Confirmation 2022 – If you would like your child to receive the Sacraments of Holy Communion or Confirmation, please get in touch in order to sign your child for the relevant course. R.C.I.A. – Our course will be starting shortly. I would encourage parishioners to keep in prayer those adults who will be preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation or become a member of the Catholic Church at Easter.
