## 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent (Year C) – 5<sup>th</sup> December 2021

1<sup>st</sup> Reading – Baruch 5:1-9
Psalm – What marvels the Lord worked for us! Indeed we were glad.

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading – Philippians 1:4-6, 8-11
Gospel – Luke 3:1-6

As we continue to wait for the Lord's coming, the Gospel makes it clear that this waiting has a purpose and direction. During this time, we are called to repent and to receive God's gift of forgiveness for all our sins. But I don't go out much, I don't do anything evil really... I'm not aware of anything to confess... I haven't committed any mortal sins, just the usual things in life, a bit of impatience or maybe said a few words out of turn. Very quickly such thinking leads to a logical conclusion – don't have to worry about too much, no need to go to confession, and in a very subtle way there is no need for the Lord anymore, all is good. We need to rephrase the questions for ourselves if we are to rediscover the urgency of the Gospel call to repentance. Maybe a more useful approach before confession is to ask ourselves: Have I lived a life of faith? How did hope feature in my conversations about others? Have I left anything undone that I could've engaged in? How did I use the time given to me in a day? In what ways have I contributed to the growth of fruits of the Holy Spirit in my heart and the hearts of others? Faith needs to be practical and the saints teach us that the closer we are to the Lord the more we are able to notice within us all that needs cleansing. One practical way we can grow in our love is by sharing with those in greater need. Please consider if you can make a difference to those who live next to us in Oxford. We are planning on refreshing our space in the porch as you enter the church

**Advent update** – The brothers will be in church for their meditation on Saturday evenings at 5.30pm during the time of Adoration and saying the Evening Prayer of the Church at 6pm. Please bring your own prayer book if you wish to join us, or just listen in silence as the prayers are being said.

Our regular confession times have resumed: Saturdays 11am-12noon and 5.30pm – 6.15pm. You will also be able to make an appointment to see a priest for confession as always apart from these times.

Advent Prayer Group – Next meeting is on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> December. We meet every Tuesday of Advent 7pm – 8.30pm in the church to pray and meditate on the message of the Word of God for us this Advent. The theme this week is God hears my prayer: "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard" (Lk. 1:5-23). The sessions will be led by Cláudia Azevedo, one of our parishioners - do join us if you can during this holy season.

**House Visits / Blessings** — An important part of my service to you as your parish priest is to come to know you, pray with you, and bless you. That is why I would like to invite myself into your homes! — not for a 3-course meal, not even a cup of tea required, but to meet you, chat, and pray. Don't be afraid — I won't turn up uninvited. If you'd like a visit, just get in touch in any way you can — speak to me after Mass in the sacristy, email, phone, fill out the form on the website, or fill in a card that should be available at the back of the church.
