Third Sunday in Ordinary Time – 22nd January 2023 1st Reading – Isaiah 8:23-9:3 Psalm – The Lord is my light and my help. 2nd Reading – First Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians – 1:10-13, 17 Gospel – Matthew 4:12-23

In today's Gospel account, Jesus is calling His disciples. One by one, as different as each character is, they are called to leave everything they were used to doing in life and set out on a new adventure. A new life awaits each one. Not so long afterwards, St. Paul sees the Corinthians struggling to live the dream. The community has seemingly forgotten to follow the most important person in the community, Jesus, and factions and disagreements have spread. People began to take sides, depending on whom they liked more and presumably who promised them or said things they wanted to have or to hear. It all happens very naturally and sometimes in a very subtle way, after all we have our likes and dislikes. The danger for the Christian community is that we may end up as followers of Brother or Father so and so, and lose sight of the Lord.

One solution for jealousy or envy is thankfulness. St. Paul reminds us of the truth that without the Lord nothing would take place at any stage of the life of the community. Each person has a specific role to fulfil, and a unique set of gifts in order to bring that mission to fruition, but the source of this variety is the Lord. He it is who sends His Spirit into us, and who ensures that we are brought together as one community for the Eucharist.
