## Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (Sunday of the Word of God) Year C – 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2022

1<sup>st</sup> Reading – Nehemiah 8:2-6, 8-10
Psalm – Your words are spirit, Lord, and they are life.

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading – 1 Corinthians 12:12-30
Gospel – Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21

In the first reading we hear about the community's reaction to the Word of God being proclaimed. Today the Church celebrates the Sunday of the Word of God and invites us to reflect on our own attitude to the same Word of God. In our busy lives, too often this life-giving Word can become secondary or even replaced by all the other activities we would rather enjoy. Listening to God can be seen as something we have no time for and this attitude can creep up on us in a very subtle way. There are many ways in which we can shut ourselves off from the Word of God.

In our parish today, we will be celebrating the service of men, women, and young people who proclaim this Word to us during Mass. As we will hear, what they do is not simply read to the congregation. Reading the Word of God requires commitment on the part of those who undertake it, in much the same way as those of us who listen also need to be committed to that task. A while ago I asked for volunteers to come forward and take up this important role in the community, and today I renew that call once again. Allow the Lord to use your voice to reach out to others.

We all know that it may not be easy at times to understand the Scriptures, even those who study them will also admit the same. The Bible can be read in many different ways, and where two or more are gathered in the Lord's name to study His words, or to meditate on them, He will always be there in the midst. If you feel you'd like to be part of such a group in the parish, or to lead such a group, please make yourself known. These things cannot happen without your active participation.

**Congratulations** – We welcome Scarlett Collins and Jaden Fernandes into the community of the Church. They have been baptized last week and we ask God's blessings upon them and their families.

1<sup>st</sup> Holy Communion – We ask the parish community to pray for all children and their families, who are now preparing for their 1<sup>st</sup> Holy Communion this summer. May this time of preparation be a time of renewal in the life of faith.

Thank you from The Gatehouse - In the last 3 months of The Gatehouse operations we have delivered 776 food parcels to those in our community most in need and had over 2000 visits to our cafe. On average we are supporting well over 250 people a week and without the help of our donors, we wouldn't be able to offer the help and support that we currently do. Christmas always brings together members of the community and this year was no different. We were on the receiving end of many donations of boxes of chocolates and new pants and socks. The chocolates have been given out to our guests and we had enough for everybody to receive a 2nd box and even potentially a 3rd! The new pants and socks donations were overwhelming and I am hopeful that the supplies we now have will last us well into 2022. It's always amazing to see people come together and help and support those in need. We are truly thankful for each and every donation we receive as without these donations, we wouldn't be able to sustain our service. I know our guests are very grateful too and if they were able to, would also extend their thanks. Please do pass on our appreciation to our kind supporters, we really couldn't do it without you! We wish you all a very happy and healthy 2022 and look forward to seeing what this year has in store for us all.
