## Third Sunday of Easter (Year B) – 18th April 2021

1<sup>st</sup> Reading – Acts 3:13-15, 17-19
Psalm – Lift up the light of your face on us, O Lord.

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading – 1 John 2:1-5
Gospel – Luke 24:35-48

Peace be with you! A simple greeting, a wish, a prayer said by the Lord in the presence of His disciples. The same message is repeated at every celebration of the Mass, the same gift is being passed on to us. We all find ourselves in different circumstances. Today the nation was asked to stand still and observe a minute's silence as the Royal Family grieved at the funeral of Prince Philip. Others would be grieving the loss of their loved ones at home, maybe soon after their funerals or getting ready for the same moment. Other people suffer because of addictions: their own lives or families broken up, thrown out to start a new life. Disagreements at home, frustrations, anger, disappointments, feeling judged or condemned, rejected, full of doubts, or fear and anxiety.

All these painful moments are important in our life, we are likely to remember them for a long time. In the midst of these experiences, the Lord stands next to us and repeats the same message, "Peace be with you!" The Lord reminds us through St. Peter in the first reading that many of those people who inflict all these pains on us probably never realized what they were truly doing. It was how God made sure that His plan for us was being fulfilled. It takes a lot of strength to think this way. It requires us to be empty of our anger and resentment in order that empathy and understanding can flood in. The end result is freedom and new life.

In order to be a person of peace, in order to live what St. Peter is telling us, we need first of all to desire it. We need to be convinced that this is who I am meant to be, that this is the starting point of my journey, that this really is my mission. Then we can look into the various ways in which we need to convert so that we may attain peace. Once we have that intention in our hearts we will start taking up our cross daily and following the One who can give us that peace. We know what that journey looks like, and we know we need the same reassuring words of peace coming from the Lord just as His disciples in the Gospel needed them. He is the One who has power over what takes place within us and disturbs us, He can heal and calm the stormy waters. Let us pray that we may continually search for the peace of the Lord within us and that this gift would be passed on through us to others.

### **Important information for EU Citizens**

If you are an EU passport holder and have not yet obtained Settled status please be aware that the deadline for this is the end of June this year. It applies regardless of how long you have been resident in the UK. Spread the word! You can ask for help with your application at **Europa Welcome**, based in East Oxford. They can help with language problems and have information on their website in **Tetum**, the language of East Timor, many of whose citizens hold Portuguese passports.
