Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C – 30th January 2022

1st Reading – Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19 Psalm – My lips will tell of your help. 2nd Reading – 1 Corinthians 12:31-13:13 Gospel – Luke 4:21-30

Jesus won the approval of all, and instead of glorying in the applause of the people, he went on to speak a bit more. He began to put words into people's mouths and told them a few home truths — a few minutes later and the same crowd was enraged. Surely it would've been better to say something nice, more appealing. Something about love might do. St. Paul speaks about it in the second reading. He lists the qualities of love and reminds us what we should keep in mind when we use that word. Love is to be patient and kind, never jealous / boastful / conceited / rude / selfish, ready to excuse, trustful, hopeful, enduring whatever comes, delighting in the truth.

We all remember bits of that list and yet often when someone reminds us of that list in a conversation it may feel like we're being attacked. We might feel that our weaknesses are being pointed out to us, the way we lack the real thing, that a point is being made. Something along the lines of what the crowd experienced in the Gospel. His truth made people very uncomfortable and they reacted, it wasn't the fault of the message.

In order for us to be open and learn to love as St. Paul describes it, we need to cultivate a spirit that is slow to take offence. Knowing that God knows every detail about us, that He has set us apart and appointed us for a particular mission in this life that no one else can fulfil, and that He is with us to deliver us, can go a long way to strengthen us at those times when we need it most. If the Lord knows the truth about me, there is no need for me to react and defend myself at all costs and in every situation — He is there to ensure we will not be overcome. His presence will become our inner strength and the source of our confidence and boldness.
