2nd Sunday of Advent (Year B) – 6th December 2020

1st Reading – Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11 Psalm – Let us see, O Lord, your mercy and give us your saving help. 2nd Reading – 2 Peter 3:8-14 Gospel – Mark 1:1-8

The Gospel this week is calling us to prepare for the Lord's arrival, and as part of this to reflect on the need to obtain God's forgiveness for our sins. To welcome the Saviour, we first of all have to be aware of our constant need of salvation, of someone who can make a real difference to my being, of someone who can transform me fully. The Son of God has that power, He alone can forgive our sins, and bring peace into our lives.

Forgiveness is made available to anyone who asks for it, with a desire to change one's way of life and in some way make up for one's sinful actions. A desire to seek God's forgiveness is already a gift of God that changes us, and that gently leads us to make the right decisions. God is offering us this gift freely, and wishes us to come and receive it, enjoy the fruits that it brings, and pass it on to others. Certain things seem insignificant to us, but whatever the circumstances, whenever we forgive we become the living image of God who is rich in mercy and compassion. What better way to prepare for the great event of Christmas, than endeavour to forgive those we live with, we work with, or who have simply crossed our paths for a brief time and hurt us. It may hurt as we try to do it, but the prize we win in the process is peace, love, and a renewal of God's image within us.
