5th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) – 7th February 2021 1st Reading – Job 7:1-4, 6-7 Psalm – Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted. 2nd Reading – 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23 Gospel – Mark 1:29-39

'Remember that my life is but a breath' says Job. We are so fragile in many different ways, and in an instant all the things we take for granted can be taken away from us. The gift of health and the ability to do the simplest of things in our daily life can sometimes be truly appreciated when it is no longer there. There aren't many of us who thank God daily for being able to use our hands, our feet, and all our senses as a gift of God. On top of these reflections, during this time of pandemic we are bombarded by a limitless supply of all sorts of strange news and conspiracy theories, and it is important to reflect on what the Church has to say.

This week we will celebrate a memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes. We know that Our Lady's presence always leads us to her Son, the source of all health. On that day we pray for the sick, not primarily for their physical recovery, but for their spiritual wellbeing, for their greater understanding and appreciation of the value of their suffering. For us as followers of Christ, suffering is a gift of God just as much as good health. It is through the suffering of Jesus that we have been saved, and our own suffering when united with that of the Lord can also contribute not just to our own salvation, but that of others too.

Let us also remember that the Lord gives wisdom and knowledge to help alleviate the suffering of others – just look at how many people work in our hospitals, hospices, care homes, community, and in the labs. The following link will give you some guidance from our Bishops regarding the vaccine:
