3rd Sunday of Lent (Year B) – 7th March 2021
1st Reading – Exodus 20:1-17
Psalm – You, Lord, have the message of eternal life
2nd Reading – 1 Corinthians 1:22-25
Gospel – John 2:13-25

The Ten Commandments given to Moses are a wonderful summary of God's law that could guide us to eternal life. They are a practical answer of God to our question: 'What must we do to enjoy eternal life?'

1st Answer: Believe in me, hope in me, love me. I am looking after you and your future. Do not go to others who claim to tell you what will happen – trust in me. Don't fall into magic, divination, fortune telling, superstition. Put me in first place.

2nd Answer: Respect my name. I am holy. Use my name to adore me, to praise me, to glorify me. Do not use it to curse others or as a swear word.

3rd Answer: Honour the sacred day of the Resurrection. It is my day. Join the community for prayer, feed on my Body and Blood in order to have life, come to listen to my Word. Make time for me. Enjoy your rest that you need.

4th Answer: Treasure your family, fulfil your duties and obligations, remember to call on me to strengthen you so you can maintain those essential family relationships. Educate your children well in all I teach you, and let children show gratitude and respect for their elders.

5th Answer: My gift of life is holy from its conception to its end. I am the Lord of life, not you. Remember every suffering has value in my eyes, don't give up in your journey – I walk with you. Address your inner conflict before it spills outwards to hurt others.

6th Answer: Learn the meaning and value of real, chaste love. You are my temple. I will help you regain mastery over your feelings and desires. Avoid occasions which you know will lead you to sin.

7th Answer: Live in justice, respect the property of others. You have what you need. I will ensure justice is done, in this life or the next.

8th Answer: Learn to live in the truth. Do not be swayed by falsehoods. I am the Truth, and I will help you discern it each time you ask me.

9th Answer: Purify your heart and be modest. It will feel like a battle, but remember I am at your side. Only the pure of heart will be able to see me.

10th Answer: Be grateful for all you have, it is all my gift to you. Gratefulness and acceptance of my gifts for you will help you to live this commandment.

Important information for EU Citizens

If you are an EU passport holder and have not yet obtained Settled status please be aware that the deadline for this is the end of June this year. It applies regardless of how long you have been resident in the UK. Spread the word! You can ask for help with your application at **Europa Welcome**, based in East Oxford. They can help with language problems and have information on their website in **Tetum**, the language of East Timor, many of whose citizens hold Portuguese passports.
