All Saints (Year B) - 31st October 2021

1st Reading – Revelation 7:2-4. 9-14
Psalm – Such are the men who seek your face, O Lord.

2nd Reading – 1 John 3:1-3
Gospel – Matthew 5:1-12

The Book of Revelation shows us what happens every time we come together as a parish community to celebrate Mass. We come from many different nations and are standing together in front of the Lamb who is present at the altar, who gives Himself to us in Holy Communion. Faith unites us, what we go through in our Christian life unites us, and it allows us to worship God together. This is already what is taking place and it is worthwhile to remind ourselves of what God has achieved. St. John reminds us at the same time that there is much more to come. These people in white robes have been washed by the Blood of the Lamb, they are saints, and what will become of us we don't know. We are still on the way and we hope to join their company and be totally transformed.

Today's solemnity is about the saints in heaven, all those who have been washed clean, who are spotless and are enjoying the presence of God to the fullest. We are rejoicing that the Lord has chosen all of them and enabled them to be victorious over sin and death. They are witnesses to what the Lord wishes to do for each of us, they show us the way, and they help us. The only thing required of us is faith and our prayer asking for their intercession. Whether you are inspired by the poverty of St. Francis of Assisi, the search for truth of St. Dominic, the little way of St. Therese of Lisieux, there is enough food for all of us.

Reading and taking about the saints is not enough. We all need to realize that we are meant to be saints. Holiness is not reserved for the few but open to everyone in all walks of life. Settling for anything else would be equivalent to giving up hope. St. Francis in his 6th Admonition tells us 'it is a great shame for us, the servants of God, that the saints have accomplished great things and we want only to receive glory and honour by recounting them'. Let us pray to God for the gift of becoming a real saint.

Congratulations to Adriano and Thrian – Adriano and Thrian will be receiving their Sacrament of Confirmation this Sunday evening at our 5.30pm Mass. We pray for them and their family, that this joyful occasion will be a beginning of another chapter in their life of faith.
