Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (Year B) – 21st November 2021

1st Reading – Daniel 7:13-14 Psalm – The Lord is king, with majesty enrobed. 2nd Reading – Revelation 1:5-8 Gospel – John 18:33-37

Today we mark the last week of our liturgical year before we move into the holy season of Advent. We are celebrating the fact that Jesus, Our Lord, is King of the Universe. He is clothed with power and glory and will come back to judge the living and the dead. He is the one in front of whom every knee shall bow in heaven and on earth. He is king and He is the ruler. It is important for us to remember that this vision of the kingship of Jesus Christ is not something that will happen on the Last Judgment, it is a present reality. The challenge for all of us is to recognize His kingship and live under it.

What does it mean for me that Jesus is my king? He doesn't order me about like others may do. His kingdom is not of this world. John reminds us today that the same Jesus finds Himself being interrogated by Pilate, seemingly being subject to the decisions of others. Can I show the same humility and allow myself to be subject to God's teaching and judgment? Jesus comes to bear witness to the truth. How well do I know God's truth in order to bear effective witness to it? To say that Jesus is my king implies that I know Him, that I wish to serve Him, that I want to listen to the voice of truth in my life. Listening and searching for God are two practical ways of showing to others that I take the kingship of Jesus seriously. Imagine what each day could look like if it was lived with a sense of expectation of learning something new that would be life-giving not just for me but for others too, if each day was spent searching for the One we claim to love, if we managed to make this our priority for the whole of our life. The Pope's call to us to take an active part in the Synod and to learn how to listen to the voice of God is a preparation for us to celebrate what this Solemnity is all about: a celebration of someone whose voice brings the dead to life, the voice that shatters all barriers preventing us from experiencing life to its fullest. Let us learn to listen to the King again.
