Divine Mercy Sunday (Year B) - 11th April 2021

1st Reading – Acts 4:32-35 Psalm – Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia 2nd Reading – 1 John 5:1-6 Gospel – John 20:19-31

Today on the 2nd Sunday of Easter the Church celebrates the Divine Mercy. We have been praying the novena in preparation for this great day and I will be entrusting the whole parish to the Divine Mercy today, and hope that you are able to join the friars online this Sunday at 3pm or at least in spirit. "Doubt no longer but believe" says Jesus to Thomas in today's Gospel. Our Lord assures us through St. Faustina, the great apostle of the Divine Mercy, that He is ready to give us many blessings and graces, ready to forgive all our sins and take their burden away. The only thing that prevents Him is our lack of trust and confidence in Him.

Throughout the Church's history God sends us messengers to draw us closer to Himself, to help us understand certain of His truths more clearly. In these last times, the Lord is revealing to us His Divine Mercy. The key aspect of the devotion is not just the veneration of the image, or the praying of the chaplet, but ensuring that we become merciful ourselves and show to others the God of mercy. Our first reading presents us with such image of mercy in action when the community shares their riches with the apostles who ensure that the poorer among them are looked after. Mercy has to be practical, and if nothing else, we can always pray for others and their intentions which will go a long way to opening our hearts to the needs of others.

Part of our journey in becoming more merciful is showing mercy to ourselves for our past sins. God is ready and waiting to forgive, but so often we hold ourselves in prison by not showing mercy to ourselves. Mercy is a free gift remember, we cannot earn it. It is not given when we become better, it is given so that we can become free and grow in holiness. We often pray for others, but maybe today we can spend some time praying for ourselves. Let us present to the Lord what we find difficult to accept within our past and ask His mercy to heal us. It may be that today is just a first step in a long journey, but it is worthwhile to make it. We can rejoice today that God loves us so much and chooses not to call to mind our sins — let us practice doing the same in relation to ourselves and others.

Important information for EU Citizens

If you are an EU passport holder and have not yet obtained Settled status please be aware that the deadline for this is the end of June this year. It applies regardless of how long you have been resident in the UK. Spread the word! You can ask for help with your application at **Europa Welcome**, based in East Oxford. They can help with language problems and have information on their website in **Tetum**, the language of East Timor, many of whose citizens hold Portuguese passports.
