Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord (Year B) – 28th March 2021 1st Reading – Isaiah 50:4-7 Psalm – My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? 2nd Reading – Philippians 2:6-11 Gospel – Mark 15:1-39

Today we begin Holy Week and are preparing ourselves for the celebration of our Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. On Maundy Thursday we will join Jesus together with His disciples for the Last Supper and thank God for the institution of the Eucharist and the ministerial priesthood. We will not be able to re-enact what Jesus did to his disciples by the washing of the feet, but we are called to reflect how we apply what He taught us in our lives. Jesus is still serving us in so many ways and is inviting us to do the same for others.

On Good Friday we will stand beneath the life-giving Cross so that together with the centurion we may profess our faith in the Son of God and come to recognize Him. We are called to gaze upon Him who was crucified for our sins. It is a day of fasting, fasting from our sinfulness in order to make room for the Lord within our hearts and to grow in our desire to be united with Him at all times.

Holy Saturday is a day filled with silent preparation and stillness. Our Lord is laying in the tomb, He is speaking with those who are dead, to bring them the Word of life. We also need to learn how to be still and silent. It is not just a matter of grin and bear it, but awaiting the Lord to bring us back to life again.

During the Easter Vigil we will proclaim that our Lord has conquered death itself. He is the Lord of the living, the God of all those who have gone before us and are in His presence. He is the One who has power to remove the heavy stones from our hearts that prevent us from experiencing our lives to the full, He is the One who can set us free.

Our celebrations on each of those days will be different from what we can remember previously, but we need to be grateful for the opportunity we have to come together in peace. Let us keep in our prayers those who are suffering and long to experience the newness of life that only the Lord can bring.

Monday – Wednesday Mass at 7.30am

Maundy Thursday Mass at 7.30pm (Please note that we won't have the Washing of the Feet, procession to the Altar of Repose, nor Watching afterwards)

Good Friday – Celebration of the Lord's Passion will take place at **12noon** and **3pm** to accommodate as many people as we can.

Easter Vigil – Mass will take place at **9pm**. We will begin in the church without any candles.

Easter Sunday – Masses will be at the usual time of **9am**, **11am**, **5.30pm**.

Please remember to bring your own mask to church and your contact details on a piece of paper and place those in the box provided as you enter the church. Please use the website like at Christmas to show us an estimated number of people who would like to come. Please note we can only accommodate a limited safe number of people. Thank you for your understanding and co-operation.

Important information for EU Citizens

If you are an EU passport holder and have not yet obtained Settled status please be aware that the deadline for this is the end of June this year. It applies regardless of how long you have been resident in the UK. Spread the word! You can ask for help with your application at **Europa Welcome**, based in East Oxford. They can help with language problems and have information on their website in **Tetum**, the language of East Timor, many of whose citizens hold Portuguese passports.
