Pentecost (Year B) - 23rd May 2021

1st Reading – Acts 2:1-11
Psalm – Send forth your Spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth.

2nd Reading – Galatians 5:16-25
Gospel – John 15:26-27; 16:12-15

The Solemnity of Pentecost is a celebration of our birth once again. Time after time the Spirit descends on us in order to breathe new life into us, to re-create us and put us back in order whilst leaving the chaos behind. The Spirit brings about unity within our being, enabling us to become living images of the Holy Trinity. We are called to recall today what we have been given at our Confirmation so that we may realize who we have become because of the Spirit's presence within us.

The group of disciples gathered together in prayer and in fear presents us with an image that we can relate with. We may belong to the Church, we may say our prayers, we may do all the right things we are supposed to, and yet fear can still rule our lives in all its dimensions. Fear can be a positive experience when it warns us of the dangers and makes us more careful and conscious of our need for safety. However, fear can also paralyze us and make us stand still. When we think of it in those terms, our spiritual lives can seem to reach a certain point and we find it extremely difficult to proceed further. Often it is fear that stops us. Fear of the unknown, fear of suffering, fear of change, fear of losing out. That is why the Spirit needs to come into our hearts once again and speak to us and take away our fear. We are unable to do it by ourselves.

In other words, the Spirit brings us an experience of real freedom. It is the Spirit who prays within us in words we could not utter ourselves, it is the Spirit who guides and enlightens, who unites and perfects us every step of the way. We do not have to understand how the Spirit does all this within us, what is more important is that we do not get in the way and invite the Spirit to be present. St. Paul in his Letter to the Galatians gives us a good check list to see how spiritual we are. It is worthwhile looking in the mirror and trying to see how we fit the description of someone who is loving, joyful, peaceful, patient, kind, good, trustful, gentle, and full of self-control. If we struggle to recognize ourselves in that list, then let us pray to the Spirit to help us grow in that direction. If we recognize those gifts within us, let us continue to pray that the Spirit will help us to grow even more.

Important information for EU Citizens

If you are an EU passport holder and have not yet obtained Settled status please be aware that the deadline for this is the end of June this year. It applies regardless of how long you have been resident in the UK. Spread the word! You can ask for help with your application at **Europa Welcome**, based in East Oxford. They can help with language problems and have information on their website in **Tetum**, the language of East Timor, many of whose citizens hold Portuguese passports.
