Pentecost Sunday Year C – 5th June 2022

1st Reading – Acts 2:1-11
Psalm – Send forth your Spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth.

2nd Reading – Romans 8:8-17
Gospel – John 14:15-16,23-26

Our Christian life is made possible through the presence and activity of the Holy Spirit within us. St. Francis of Assisi exhorted his brothers never to lose sight of this truth, and in whatever they were to do, to have the Spirit present within them and be open to His holy activity was paramount. The Acts of the Apostles teach us that we, the Church, have a mission to fulfil. Our sins and failings make us close the doors of our hearts and leave us imprisoned, whereas the Spirit comes to us in order that we spread the message about the marvels that God has done. It is the Spirit who reaches out and makes what we say understood by others. There is no more reason to be afraid or of wondering what to do next as the Spirit inspires whomever He chooses.

Today is an opportunity to remind ourselves about the gifts and the fruits of the Spirit. We have received wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. What do they mean for me and how have I put them into practice? One sure way to find out is to examine ourselves in the light of the fruits of the Spirit. These are formed in us by the Spirit as we remain open and faithful to the inspiration we receive. Here is what a spiritual person looks like and what will be visible for all to see: charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity. Looking into our own hearts and checking for signs of spiritual health is a worthwhile thing to do. We don't need to make any appointments but it can prove to be more life-giving than any visit to the doctors. The Lord wants us to be healthy and to have concrete goals along our journey. Let us renew our resolution to model our lives on the picture painted by the fruits of the Spirit and renew our trust in the Spirit's guidance.
