Seventh Sunday of Easter Year C – 29<sup>th</sup> May 2022

1<sup>st</sup> Reading – Acts 7:55-60 Psalm – The Lord is king, most high above all the earth. 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading – Revelation 22:12-14,16-17,20 Gospel – John 17:20-26

As we continue this week our novena to the Holy Spirit in preparation for next Sunday's Solemnity of Pentecost, we hear in the Gospel of today Jesus making His intentions clear: unity among His children. The mission of achieving this unity is a life-long task and it always starts with our own hearts. We are often pulled in opposite directions, desiring holiness and yet often choosing to sin. If we do not acknowledge it and keep focus on the direction set out by the Gospel, and make use of the sacraments and other means to be set free from sin, then our inner conflicts spread outwards and we share them with others. Communities can quickly fall apart. Our lives are meant to reflect the unity that exists between the Father and the Son, and that can only become possible if we are united by the Spirit that comes to us from the Father and the Son. Let us reflect this week on the many ways we could become instruments of peace and what we could do differently in order to give peace a greater chance.
