The Most Holy Trinity (Year B) – 30th May 2021 1st Reading – Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40 Psalm – Happy the people the Lord has chosen as his own. 2nd Reading – Romans 8:14-17 Gospel – Matthew 28:16-20

We begin all our prayers in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. In this name we have been baptised. We only know who God is because the Father wishes to be known and recognized as such by His children. Our whole life is a pilgrimage whose goal is to be in the presence of the Father. The same Father as we know is living in unapproachable light, and only becomes fully known when the Word of God is sent by the Father to us and becomes human like us. Jesus, our Lord, is that eternal Word of God who reveals the face of the Father. It is from the same Jesus that we discover that He is led by the Holy Spirit, the same Spirit given to us in baptism and confirmation who will reveal and teach us the whole truth.

In the Holy Trinity we see a model of community life, a model in whose image and likeness we have been created, and whom we are called to imitate. The mission of the Holy Trinity is to share the divine life with us, to save us from the lies of sin, and prepare us for eternal life that starts today. The Holy Trinity is the source of all goodness, and we as tiny as we are in relation to the whole created world, matter deeply to God who created us out of love. The best response we could possibly offer to God is to make that mission our own. We can make a following decision, that we would like to be an instrument of God's goodness in people's lives, someone who can point out a way of life to others that allows them to truly experience the deepest desires of their hearts. This requires us to be committed to a life of conversion.

To imitate the example of the Trinity we need to seek unity and love. As the restrictions we have all faced are slowly being lifted, we face another journey of becoming more united again as children of the Father. We can learn to appreciate the presence of others in a new way, whatever the new normal may be. God does not change and is always there in the midst of all the changes we have to face. Let us pray we may be reconnected with one another soon face to face, and recognize the presence of God within one another when we do.

1st Holy Communion – Next Sunday on the 6th June, Christabela Fernandes Soares and Jecarinha Tilman Freitas will receive their 1st Holy Communion during the 11am Mass. We pray for them and their families as they prepare for this joyful occasion.

Important information for EU Citizens

If you are an EU passport holder and have not yet obtained Settled status please be aware that the deadline for this is the end of June this year. It applies regardless of how long you have been resident in the UK. Spread the word! You can ask for help with your application at **Europa Welcome**, based in East Oxford. They can help with language problems and have information on their website in **Tetum**, the language of East Timor, many of whose citizens hold Portuguese passports.
